Cow Creek Umpqua Indian Foundation Gives \$785,806 to Sixty-nine Charities in Southwestern Oregon

Canyonville, Oregon........The Cow Creek Umpqua Indian Foundation (CCUIF), will be awarding \$785,806 to sixty-nine charities in Southwestern Oregon at Seven Feathers Convention Center at 1 pm on Wednesday, January 11, 2023. It's been three years since the last "in person" presentation ceremony for CCUIF took place. Non-profits receiving awards are located in Coos, Deschutes, Douglas, Jackson, Josephine, Klamath, and Lane Counties.

The CCUIF was founded in 1997 and began is philanthropic efforts in 1998, To date, the Foundation has awarded \$22,324,952 to non-profits in the seven southwestern Oregon counties from which it accepts grant requests. Grants are awarded semi-annually, in January and June. In June of 2022, the CCUIF awarded \$649,930 to 61 non-profits.

Foundation Executive Director Carma Mornarich said, "It is so fulfilling to see over three quarters of a million dollars be awarded to these 69 hardworking non-profits. What these charities bring to the table is incalculable in terms of aid and support given to deserving people and people in need. Despite the pandemic, climate change, civil strife, and war, these charities focused on mission and goal and they delivered."

The mission of the Cow Creek Umpqua Indian Foundation is to offer assistance in education, strengthen youth and family, provide for positive youth development, and add to the quality of life for people in southwestern Oregon. The Foundation has put increasing emphasis upon basic needs so more hungry people are fed.

The 69 grantees this round of giving include: four grantees from Coos County will receive a total of \$50,000; thirteen grantees from Deschutes County will receive a total of \$153,500; seven grantees from Douglas County will receive a total of \$83,000; fourteen grantees from Jackson County will receive a total of \$168,923; seven grantees from Josephine County will receive a total of \$91,600; two grantees from Klamath County will receive a total of \$30,000; fourteen grantees from Lane County will receive a total of \$132,880, and eight grantees from multiple counties will receive a total of \$75,903.

Cow Creek Umpqua Indian Foundation awards are made separately from and in addition to regular philanthropic decisions made by the Cow Creek Tribal Board.
