Working with students pre-K through high school seniors, we covered topics like: mason bees, soil health, beneficial insects, riparian ecology, native plant gardens, and much more!

At community and PPRV-organized events and classes, we engaged with over 1,250 people! Events like the Talent Harvest Festival and Earth Day gave us the opportunity to engage with people of all ages about the value of pollinators.
